

## **Fr. Alexander Lucie-Smith – A brief profile**

Fr Alexander Lucie-Smith was born in Rustington in 1963, his family living in nearby East Preston or Angmering-on-Sea, as it was then known. When he was still quite young, the family moved to Malta, where he went to school, though he later went to an English boarding school at the age of thirteen.

Since leaving school, Fr Alexander has had a long and varied career. He read English at Oxford, and then later studied for the priesthood at the Gregorian University in Rome, where he was awarded a doctorate in Moral Theology. He has taught in several schools, and also taught for four years at Tangaza College, Nairobi, Kenya, part of the Catholic University of East Africa, where he was the head of Moral and Pastoral Theology.

He has written several books, some of which are still in print, and he has also been a longstanding contributor to various publications, such as the Church Times, the Tablet and the Catholic Herald. He currently has an online column at the Catholic Herald website. He has been parish priest of St Hugh's Knaphill since 21st September 2012.
